

Drug Donation for HIV Prevention

In May, our programs in Democratic Republic of Congo received a significant donation of medications, essential to our HIV prevention services.

The medications, shipped to our doctors working out of HEAL Africa, will provide 500 pregnant women with medication to prevent the HIV transmission to their infant during delivery.

Harold Dick, a long-time Global Strategies supporter, purchased and donated the medications to Global Strategies. Remarkably, this is his second gift of this kind to our programs for women.

The donation also included something increasingly valuable to our program in Goma where sexual violence against women occurs at a rate unparalleled in other regions. The donation included 1,000 post exposure prophylactic (PEP) kits which, when used within 72 hours will prevent victims of rape from contracting HIV, sexually transmitted infections, and pregnancy.

We are incredibly thankful for this generous gift of medications which allows our doctors and nurses to continue transforming lives in Democratic Republic of Congo.
